

The Department of Applied Social Studies is delighted to announce that the part-time, in-service MSocSc Community Work and Youth Work (MCYWP) is now being offered on a blended basis and will commence in November 2023.



The MCYWP is an integrated programme of professional and academic education and training. Its innovative design and 'block and blend' delivery mode offers a unique opportunity for practitioners to combine work and post-graduate study to achieve a professional qualification in community work, youth work and associated equality, human rights, international development, local development, local authority, national institutions, and international agency work.

The MCYWP programme combines oncampus learning in five 3-day blocks* annually spread throughout the academic year along with weekly online sessions and supervised fieldwork practice in youth work and community work organisations. As MCYWP students, you will study c. 35-45 ECTS each year which includes supervised fieldwork practice projects in your own organisation in Years 1 and 3 with an external block fieldwork placement in Year 2.

- 2. You are currently employed as a community worker or youth worker for a minimum of 20 hours per week
- You have your employer's support to participate in all aspects including study visits, placement, on campus blocks and online sessions
- 4. You can commit to meeting the mandatory internal and external fieldwork practice requirements over the 3 years of the programme.
